## Principal Report

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

We have moved swiftly into Week 4 of Term. We have had some wonderful Autumn weather to start the term and the students are making the most of it while they can. I have spoke to the students about wearing clothing that is appropriate to the weather conditions and to have all their clothing clearly named.

The last two weeks we have seen the dental van come to our school. A large percentage of our students had their teeth checked. This has been a great talking and teaching point for all our students, raising the awareness of how important it is to not only look after our teeth but our whole body. We had several Grade 3-6 students represent our school at the District Athletics. They all competed to the best of their ability, we are extremely proud of them and how they have represented our school.

Assessment

Over the next two weeks, all our classrooms will be completing assessments. These assessments will inform teacher judgements for this semester. It is important that we have students here as much as possible. If they miss a day, there will be assessments they will miss out on. We like to allow students ample time and not make it a rushed process.

#### Parent/Carer/Teacher Interviews

As mentioned in Term 1 this year, we will hold Parent/Teacher/Carer interviews in Term 1, 2, and 4. Our Term 2 interviews will allow parents and carers to discuss the teacher judgement that has been given to your child for Semester 1 and to discuss all other aspects of the report. During this interview, students won't be required to attend. The sole focus will be on your child's learning and how we can work together to provide the best outcomes for them. We are allowing 10 minutes for all interviews.

#### **Student Reports**

This semester, we will see some differences to our school report. They will be smaller in size and will be mainly focussed on the teacher judgement and general comment. We have discussed with school council that parents would benefit more from additional PTIs, rather than having a larger report to read.

#### **Excursions**

There have been a few notes go home for several different excursions: Swimming and the Art Gallery excursions. We ask that those be returned to school ASAP, so we can work out numbers of staff to attend.

Well done Grade 1/2E I am very proud of your efforts!





Start with hands flat, palms up, at hips. Move hands up and forward in an arc so that arms cross past each other and end at side of head.




