
#### ASSEMBLY

This week in the 3/4 class we have been reading a book titled 'Sailing the Unknown: Around the World With Captain Cook'. It tells of a young sailor named Nicholas, aged 11, who took on a three-year expedition of discovery, venturing into an unchartered world filled with strange lands, mysterious people and peculiar creatures. The book takes the form of a journal and highlights the hardships, events, and lengthy duration of the voyage.

Interestingly, after watching some YouTube videos about Captain Cook and his adventures, the character Nick proved to be a real-life person and one who was a part of this journey. Furthermore, he was the first to spot land at New Zealand and - living up to his promise - Captain Cook named that place after the first person to see it – Nick; this is located on the eastern coast of the North Island and known as 'Young Nick's Head'.

The book also describes events and interactions with aboriginals upon arrival at Australian shores, as well as the other islands and places they discovered on their travels around the world.



> Students then have the opportunity to correct them. The grade is getting very quick at recalling these facts! Good work (\*) Grade 5/65!!!




