#### **BUILDING WORKS**

Over the school holidays there has been plenty of work occurring in the school. We have had new cabinetry installed in our library; this has created a more open space which will assist with the running of OSHC. Our Foundation room has also had new cabinetry installed and has created a lovely space for our new students. Our basketball court is still a work in progress and will be covered with a new synthetic grass in the coming weeks.

#### SCHOOL DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

We ask that all parents and carers collect students from the back of the school grounds. The gate is opened five minutes before the students make their way outside. This helps to reduce congestion in the front office and allows staff to know that students have been collected by a family member.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

In 2024, we are aiming to increase attendance rates of all students. Every moment of school counts and if your child misses' school for no reason they are at risk of missing valuable learning. If your child is sick and is absent from school, please send a note to the class teacher explaining the absence or ring the office.

#### **UNIFORM**

It has been mind-blowing to see how many students are wearing our new school uniform, they look incredible. As mentioned last year, it is compulsory for our new foundation students to wear the new school uniform, but all other students have a two-year period where they can mix and match the old school uniform with the new. At the office, we are only selling beanies and hats – all other uniform is to be purchased from Beleza.

#### **HOME READING**

Our home reading will look slightly different this year. Students from Foundation to Grade 4 will have decodables sent home with them. On these texts, there will be a sticker that says, 'read to you'. This will be your student's text. There will also be another text that has a sticker on the text that says 'read to me' this is for parents and carers to demonstrate proficient reading to students. We will also be holding an information session at school in the coming weeks, during this session we will show how to model reading and what to look for when you child is reading. All students will be required to have a reader bag. Reader bags can be purchased from Beleza, but students can use their reader bag from 2023.

#### **HOUSE ATHLETIC SPORTS**

Our 2024 House Athletic Sports will be held on Thursday the 28<sup>th</sup> March. This will be our final day of school and students will be dismissed for the term at the completion of the events which is at 2.00pm.

#### **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Breakfast club is up and running for 2024 once again. Our school doors are open from 8.00am for the students to come in and have breakfast.

#### **OSHC**

It has been wonderful to see so many families utilising our after-school hours care program. It is open in the library from 3.15pm to 6.00pm. For families that haven't made a profile yet, it does take 24 hours process.

Again, it has been a fantastic start to 2024. We are looking forward to work with you and your children this year.




# GRADE 3/4 News
